Findings from a survey among 500 adults

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
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Methodology of Survey

- Lake Research Partners designed and administered this survey that was conducted by telephone using professional interviewers.
 - This survey reached a total of 500 adults in Bay County, Michigan. The survey was conducted June 23rd-28th, 2016. The margin of error for this survey is +/-4.4% and higher among subgroups.
- Telephone numbers for the sample were generated from a file of adults in Bay County and geographically stratified. The data were weighted slightly by gender, region, age, race, and party identification.
- In interpreting survey results, all sample surveys are subject to possible sampling error that is, the results of a survey may differ from those that would be obtained if the entire population were interviewed. The size of the sampling error depends upon both the total number of respondents in the survey and the percentage distribution of responses to a particular question. For example, if a response to a given question which all respondents answered was 50%, we could be 95% confident that the true percentage would fall within plus or minus 4.4% of this percentage, or between 45.6% and 54.4%. Of course, the sampling error is greater for subgroups.

Key Findings – Physical Health

Adults:

- 16% of Bay County adults say they have no current health needs. Of those who identify ways to improve their health, nutrition and weight management is the top priority.
- A majority of adult residents have had preventive blood pressure screenings (75%), routine physical exams (73%), dental checkups (72%), and cholesterol screenings (64%) in the past 12 months.

Children:

- Most children are receiving regular check-ups and pediatrician visits, but 15% are not. Finding a doctor is the most common barrier.
- Preventative dental care is lacking. One in three Bay County parents has a child who has not seen a dentist in the past 12 months. Nearly half of these parents did not feel that their child needed to see a dentist.



Key Findings – Adult Mental Health

- More than one in five Bay County adults experience mental health issues of some level. 10% have experienced poor mental health for six or more days in the past month. However, mental health conditions and emotional problems are rarely limiting.
 - Women, especially women who are younger, unmarried, or with children, are most likely to experience poor mental health.
 - 39% of Bay County residents have had anxiety in the past month, while
 28% experienced depressed thoughts.
- 11% of Bay County residents are receiving mental health treatment of some kind. But not all residents with mental health needs are being treated.
 - Of the Bay County adults who experienced poor mental health for at least one day in the past month, only 16% are receiving treatment.
 - Despite reporting lower levels of mental health, women with children do not seek treatment at a higher rate.



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Key Findings – Health Insurance & Programs


- The majority of Bay County residents (53%) have insurance through their employer or their spouse's employer. A large number are insured through Medicare (26%) or Medicaid (14%).
- While the vast majority of residents have health insurance, 5% do not. Most of the uninsured have been without health insurance for more than one year.
 - The percentage of residents who are uninsured could be higher since those without insurance may be reluctant to report it.
 - Cost is the most common barrier to being insured.
- Bay County parents have children enrolled in a variety of programs, including private insurance (35%), Medicaid (11%), MIChild (8%).



Physical Health of Bay County Adults




16% of adults in Bay County report they have no have no health issues currently. The biggest concerns are nutrition and weight management. Sixteen percent of Bay County residents identify no health care concerns. Other residents report a variety of needs, with nutrition and weight management topping the list.





Residents are most likely to have had preventive blood pressure screenings, dental checkups, and routine physical exams.




Had Preventive Screenings in Last 12 Months



Q12: In the past 12 months, have you had any of the following preventive screenings?


A large majority of residents, as well as majorities of all subgroups, report having had a routine physical exam in the last 12 months. Collegeeducated women are most likely to have had a physical.



Had Routine Physical Exam in Last 12 Months




Sixteen percent of residents report using cigarettes, cigars, and/or pipes. Unmarried men, men below age 50, and adults between the ages of 30-39 are most likely to use cigarettes, cigars, and/or pipes every day. Very few residents use e-cigarettes or smokeless tobacco.





Only 4% of residents report using drugs in the past year, possibly due to the sensitive nature of the topic. Marijuana is the only drug mentioned.




Drugs Used in Past Year





Mental Health of Bay County Adults


One in five residents report that their mental health has not been good at least one day in the past month, including 10% who indicate issues for six or more days. 21% of residents say their mental health has not been good for at least one of the past 30 days, including 10% who have experienced issues for six or more days. However, mental health conditions and emotional problems are rarely limiting.

Q35: Are you limited in any activities because of mental or emotional problems, such as depression?







Q31: Thinking about your mental health, which includes stress, depression, and problems with emotions, for how many days during the past 30 days was your mental health not good?


Anxiety is more prevalent than depression for Bay County residents.



Q32: During the past 30 days, for about how many days have you felt sad, blue, or depressed?


Q33: During the past 30 days, for about how many days have you felt worried, tense, or anxious?








Q32: During the past 30 days, for about how many days have you felt sad, blue, or depressed?

11% of all residents are receiving mental health treatment. Of the residents experiencing 1 to 5 days with poor mental health, only 18% are receiving treatment.

Women with children are highly likely to have poor mental health, but are not more likely to seek out help.



Health Services for Children

About one quarter of Bay County residents are currently raising children. While most children have been the doctor in the past year, approximately one in four is not getting the dental care he or she needs. Of the 27% of residents who have children under 18 years old, 35% enroll their children in some form of private insurance. 11% of parents report that their children are enrolled in Medicaid.




Q11: Do you have any children under the age of 18?

Almost one in three parents have a child who has not been to the dentist in the past 12 months.




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
Q27: How many of your children have seen a dentist in the past 12 months?


Q23. How many of your children have seen a doctor for an annual check-up in the past 12 months?

Health Insurance

85% of Bay County residents have health insurance. Of the 5% of residents currently without health insurance, 63% have been uninsured for over one year. Most Bay County residents have insurance of some kind. Of the 5% of residents currently without health insurance, 63% have been uninsured for over one year.




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Q15: Do you currently have health insurance?

The majority of residents have insurance through their employer or their spouse's employer. A large number are insured through Medicare or Medicaid.




Source of Insurance
